Everyone is invited to participate in the **Red & White People Parade!** This annual parade, open to anyone sporting our national colours, will leave the Metro Parking lot at Princess & Barrie at 11:30am. It will travel down Princess Street to Ontario and City Hall.

This year the parade will do double-duty celebrating not only national pride but also the re-opening of lower Princess Street. On the way down, parade-goers will pause briefly for a quick announcement from the Town Crier.

The **Civic Ceremonies** will occur directly after at approximately noon at the steps of City Hall. Awards will be presented to the First Capital Award Winners as well as recipients of the Mayor's Award for Youth Volunteerism.

At 1pm head over to Crawford Warf (at the foot of Brock Street) for the **Mayor's Sailpast**. Watch as watercraft from the area sail by the dock with both vessel and crew dressed up in their Canada Day finest!

Don't forget about wagon rides, music in the park, a motorcycle show 'n shine and **much more!**

The day's festivities will be capped off with a glorious **fireworks** display at 10pm sharp! Get to Confederation Park early and reserve your spot!
